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Key Content

We will find out about the signs of Spring and look for evidence in our school grounds. This includes looking for blossom, shoots, birds making nests, daffodils and other Spring flowers. We will listen out for bird song and buzzing insects. We will think about what the weather is like in the Spring.

We will find out about how to plant seeds; what we need and how we should look after them. We will make observations of them as they grow.

We will go on a minibeast hunt to our wildlife area to find out what minibeasts are and where they like to live. We will find out about the life cycles of frogs and caterpillars.

We will find out about the coronation of Charles III and what it means. We will design crowns and robes and write invitations for our own coronation.
